

Library of Congress O-103

Another unique stereo card, the only surviving example of which is in the Library of Congress. The recent discovery of upper image B proves that this card, long considered a true three-dimensional photograph, was actually made up by images c and D of a four-view plate taken by a multiple-lens camera. Usually attributed to Brady, this carte-de-visite photograph may have been taken by E. & H. T. Anthony & Co. (predecessors of Ansco) in 1865. Their imprint appears on this view as well as on their stereograph of a similar pose (O–104). An exact reprint was issued of O–103 many years after the war by the Keystone View Company.
