FOUR NEW BODIES FOR LINCOLN. Even while Lincoln was alive, enterprising artists created composite engravings of him, using his head mounted on the bodies of other men to save effort and costs in new art work and plates. Some of these composite engravings were copied by the camera and sold as photographs.
